Above is Dean Cross. In 'Icarus, my Son' the words 'BETWEEN A FEATHER AND AN EDGE' are painted in large white capital letters on a dark platform that surrounds the Gallery. These words connect the exhibition to the Greek myth of Icarus and Daedalus.

In Gallery 2, Emma Rani Hodges has placed the words 'and I go and I' in their textile work. Emma uses text to investigate pattern and form.

Let's get making!

What you'll need:

Paper	Palette	Stencil
Acrylic paint	Brushes	Sponges

Step 1

Choose a word that means something to you. It could be your name or a word from a song. We chose our favourite word 'ART'.

Step 2

Pick some colours and create a background for your painting. We have chosen eye-catching pinks and greens. Let it dry.



Step 3

Pop your stencil onto your paper and lightly sponge paint onto your letter. Gently lift the stencil to reveal your letter underneath. Repeat until you have created your word.



Step 4

Words are our starting point. We are creating an artwork so it's ok if your words can't be read.
